Scripture Reading

Acts 2:1-13

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this

Father, we practice to reflect those same rhythms of honesty and forgiveness in our relationships with others.

As we take this time to practice reconciliation with God, think about whom else in your life you need to practice reconciliation with.

Consider pursuing that conversation right now, before continuing to the Scripture reading.

Jesus said "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick" (Luke 5:31). It is wonderful to know that we do not have to come to God "all cleaned up," but that He welcomes us to come to Him as we are, to find help and healing.

Our human tendency is to forget. After all, that's why we have "to-do" lists and calendar apps that are full of reminders! In His goodness, God has given us His Word to remind us of who we are and how we are to live. Our Scripture this morning reminds us of these two very things – the identity and mission of the Church.

Even if you are alone in your home this morning, we encourage you to read these words aloud as a part of our proclaiming the Scriptures
